Varsities to benefit of from Sh220m research fund

Kenyan universities are umong institutions to benefit from a Sh220 million grant to boost scientific capaciry.

According to the Regional Initiative in Science and Education (RISE), the funds would be given through three research groups to strengthen science teaching in sub-Saharan Africa universities.

Dr Thomas Egwang, executive director of the African Academy of Sciences in Nairobi, welcomed the initiative.

RISE, which aims at strengthening higher education in science and engineering by increasing the number of PhD and MSc scientists and engineers in Africa's universities, is supported by a \$3.3 million (Sh214.5 million) grant from the Carnegie Corporation of New York and the New Jersey Science Initiative Group at the Institute of Advanced Study.

President of Carnegie Comoration varian Gregorian said in a press statement. The establishment of a region al scientific research centre is in response to demands in Africa for more and better university instructors.
